Cayden Brown is a 18-year-old child rights defender and awarded activist, recognized for his impact on juvenile justice at his notably young age. At just 16, he was appointed as a juvenile defender in Oakland County's Teen Court juvenile diversion program, gaining mass recognition for his unbroken series of courtroom victories.

He earned his first legal credential from Harvard Law School at 17, studying the constitutional foundations of race and American law. He's the CEO of the bold nonprofit, The Trespass Project, that works to help children across the globe understand their nations' legal systems. He's spoken before world leaders at the United Nations and has been featured in Forbes and TIME Magazine. Regarded as "the world's most influential juvenile justice advocate" by ABC News, Cayden epitomizes an era in advocacy where all become stewards of change—regardless of age.
